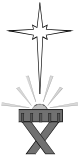

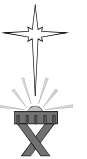

Community of Faith Report - November 2010

The popular Alpha course was held in GWUC in August in the home of Greg and Judy.

20 members and friends attended these 15 weeks sessions which included an Alpha weekend in Hastings, in the home of the Fry's

How well was the course received?

Here are the evaluations of some of the participants:

I find the Alpha course gives everyone who attended the sessions a good, clear and real view of the following questions:

Where does one find God?

One can find Him in the lives of each one of us.

How does God work his miracles to us today?

He does in the shared individual testimonies - the experience, in prayers answered and in the change and the awareness of God's ways in our lives.

Most of the examples given by Nikki are "down to earth" truth hence making the sessions interesting.

The Alpha Course has done me a lot of good. It has taught me to look at the Bible and Christianity in a different light. The simple but normal questions we ask concerning our Christian faith seem to reach our hearts and minds in more approachable answers in this modern and complicating world that we now live in. The Bible has been written decades ago and some of the things written do not apply comfortably in our time. In a big church surrounding we seldom talk or even smile and wish each other especially in the western society. Those who have problems making friends will often feel lonely and left out. In smaller groups of Bible Studies like this one we get to know each other better and will definitely wish each other in church or elsewhere when we meet again. I would like to attend short courses like this one in the future have been in this church. **Anna**

Just realised I have to make a short comment on the Alpha course and its benefits to me. On the whole I think the Alpha course is a very basic but very effective and inspirational approach to the teaching and understanding of the Christian faith.

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION

Last Monday evening one hundred members met and agreed unanimously to invite Rev. Rosemary Carter to join the ministry team at Glen Waverley. Rosemary will conclude her chaplaincy at Uniting Care Moreland Hall shortly and expects to begin her ministry with us on 1st February 2011.



Rosemary's husband Rev. David Carter ministers at Glen Iris Uniting Church. They have two adult children.

Rosemary has degrees in Theology and Social Work and is a registered nurse. Rosemary was ordained in 1996, after which she had two team ministry placements in Adelaide, South Australia.

During that time Rosemary was involved with the SA Council of Churches and the Synod of SA Social Justice Commission.

An office-bearer from a previous congregation said of Rev. Carter that "She places high importance on the preparation and delivery of worship, and she can lead both innovative and traditional styles. A strength is her pastoral leadership – she attends to people. Rosemary is a team player. She is consultative and works for consensus decisions."

Rev Carter told the Joint Nominating Committee that her relationship with God is central – she has confidence that she is loved, accepted and free. She believes that through the life and ministry of Jesus we see how to act and respond in ways that express God's love in the world, and is convinced that the Spirit witnesses through the prophets, Jesus and all people of faith throughout the ages.

We welcome Rosemary as she joins Greg and Alanee in team ministry and, with them, leads us in mission and service to the people of Glen Waverley.

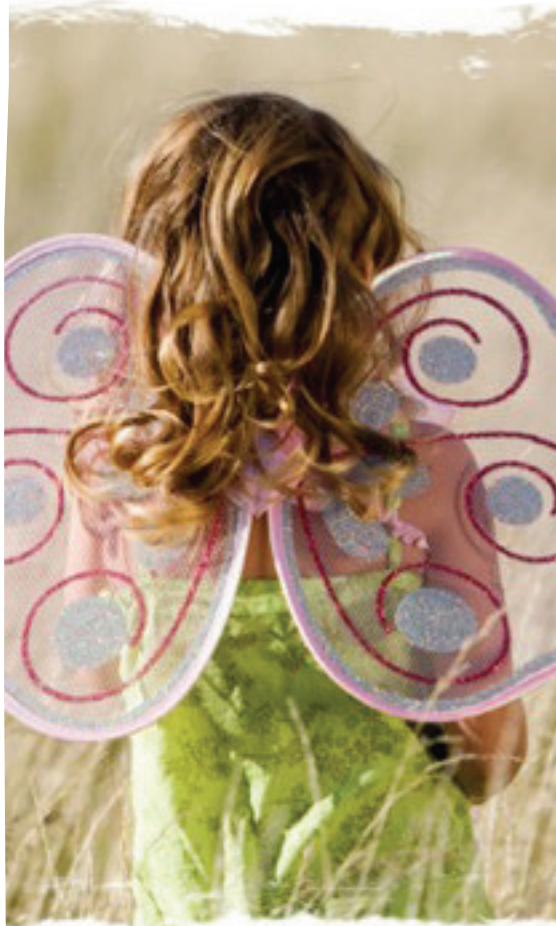
