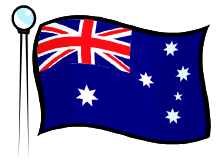

POST EASTER STUDY – “**EVERYTHING MUST CHANGE**”

This study is based on Brian McLaren's book of the same name.

“Our world faces unprecedented challenges and crises and the church will either be part of the problem or part of the solution. To be part of the solution, followers of Christ must be ready for a bold new adventure of faith and action.”

Groups did this study during 2009. It sparked great debate and interest about what the life and teachings of Jesus have to say about current societal and global issues.

Part 1 – Discussion centred on “Are we, the church, doing what Jesus intended? Are we, the individuals in the church, focussing too much on “me”, “my soul”, “my spiritual life” and my “eternal destination” rather than addressing dominant societal and global realities: systemic injustice, systemic poverty, systemic ecological crises, and systemic dysfunctions of many kinds? The group felt that GWUC is aware and responding to some issues that Jesus would have us address but asked the question – Where to now?

Although there are 8 Sessions in the complete study, one may join the group at any stage and attend as many sessions as one wishes.

To have read the relevant chapters (Parts) of the book pertaining to a Session would be advantageous but not essential.

NEW CHURCH WIKI

Previously you will have seen an announcement in the Bulletin about how to create a user name and password for yourself, so that you can visit the new church wiki, hosted at the new permanent location: wiki.gwuc.org.au

This week, we will explore navigation in the wiki, and how you can keep up-to-date with what is happening on it.

Navigating the wiki:

WikiNames are two or more words, capitalized and "glued" together, like Wiki-Name. These have a special purpose in the wiki, and are the names of pages in the wiki. The first word in the name is often used to indicate what part of the church activities the wiki page describes, such as in Congregational Meeting 14 April 2010, or Council Page.

Whenever you see a WikiName in a WikiPage, it is usually highlighted in blue, indicating that it is a link to another (wiki) page. Clicking on these links will take you to that page, just as links in a normal web page do. The main difference is that the address is just the WikiName, without all the server information. For example - <http://wiki.gwuc.org.au/gwuc/CongregationalMeeting12Apr2010> and CongregationalMeeting12Apr2010 are the same wiki page, but the second shorter form is what is used inside a WikiPage - hence the idea that the wiki gives a "quick" way of linking to other pages ("wiki" is Hawaiian for "quick").

Up the top of the wiki page, the system keeps a list of the last 5 or so pages that you have visited. This is convenient if you want to jump back quickly to those pages. The GWUCHomePage is also listed, just after the Uniting Church logo, as GWUCWiki, so you can jump quickly to that as well. On the HomePage itself are "quick links" to all the activities of the church covered by the wiki.

Subscribing to wiki pages:

If you have a particular relationship with one of the many church groups, you will want to know what's happening in that group. The wiki allows you to "Subscribe" to various pages, so that you will get sent an email whenever some new information is posted to that page. At the top of each page is a line containing various links (and the pull-down menu "More Actions"). In that line you will see the word "Subscribe". If you click this link, you can subscribe yourself to get an email whenever this page is updated.

If (when) you get sick of those emails, that same link will now say "Unsubscribe", and clicking it will reverse the subscription.

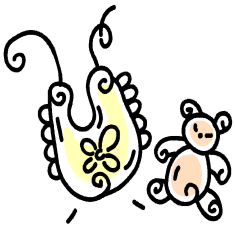

PRECIS OF CONGREGATIONAL MEETING held 12th April 2010

Last Monday evening members of the congregation heard enthusiastic reports of happenings in the *On the Way Together* strategies of our church community. Ross Mackinnon, Jan Clear, Judith Greenwood and Lyn McDonald told down to earth stories of people finding and growing in the Christian faith. Many of these stories have been and will be told in the *Bulletin* from time to time.

John Hurst gave a comprehensive assessment of the life and work of the Congregation, which will likely be published in a future edition of *Newview*. Roger Vass presented the Annual Statement of Accounts which showed an income of \$450000 and a small surplus for year 2009. The meeting received the Statement subject to audit.

John Colvin reported that the manse and hall building developments were now completed and had been formally approved by the Building Surveyor. All costs of the work had been met by the sale of the Berkley manse without any payments being made out of the General Fund.

Ross Mackinnon spoke about the growing involvement of Elders in worship and pastoral activities. He commented that it was great to see new members accepting responsibility as Elders.

Alison Dingwall, one of our three Presbytery representatives, shared with us the excitement and the growing pains of the new Port Phillip East Presbytery.

The most significant decision of the meeting was to resolve to appoint a Joint Nominating Committee (joint with the Presbytery) to call a minister to fill the vacancy left when Rev Lynette Dungan finished her term at Glen Waverley. The Committee was asked to look for an ordained minister in the first instance. Papers that canvassed various ministry arrangements were presented by the Church Council and by the Ministry Team. These are available through the church office to anyone who was unable to attend the meeting.

OUTREACH MISSIONAL GROUP

This month's Outreach Mission Group received exciting updates on a number of current Outreach activities, and we are pleased to pass this news on to you:

CLOSE THE GAP

On the 25th March GWUC hosted a dinner and informative session to recognise National Close the Gap Day 2010, a day that seeks to raise awareness about indigenous health issues in the wider community. With presentations from Bec Weterings, a third year Nursing student, Nicole Boyer, a practicing dietician and Amé Pocklington, one of our church interns, plus a fabulous dinner, the evening was most definitely a success.

KNITTING FOR AFRICA

During their recent trip to South Africa, Alex and Walter Skilton distributed the clothing knitted by members of the congregation to some of the poorest people in the country. Wherever they went the items were very gratefully received as the need was so great. Many of the donations were passed on to the community based organisation, Philani, which runs a Child Health & Nutrition Project in one of the poorest areas outside Cape Town. Also, some garments, blankets and wool were given to the Woman's Auxiliary Group and the Ladies Morning Fellowship at the Tableview Methodist Church, who will in turn pass them on to the Emmanuel Centre, for needs of cerebral palsy children in Atlantis. Our heartfelt thanks go to all who supported this initiative and donated materials, and especially to Alex and Walter, who have enabled these items to reach communities where they are so desperately needed.

LAURA IN MANINGRIDA

Laura Morgan is currently working as a Year 3 teacher in Maningrida, a remote town in Arnhem Land, Northern Territory. The community is 90% indigenous, and for many of the students English is their second or third language. Over the Easter School Holidays she returned for a short visit to Melbourne, and had the opportunity to share her experience with some members of the congregation.
